



Statement of Need

Experts in the field of Reproductive Psychiatry and a survey of the literature find that psychiatric disorders in relation to a woman's reproductive lifecycle are underdiagnosed and under-treated. There is a need to improve clinicians' ability to recognize these disorders, to understand their pathophysiology, and to design treatment plans tailored to the needs of individual patients.

Course Description

The 6th NYU Reproductive Psychiatry Conference will be held jointly with the North American Society of Psychosocial Obstetrics and Gynecology, expanding the faculty and target audience. This conference is also held in cooperation with Postpartum Support International. Continuing our tradition of presenting the most up-todate information available, the faculty will cover Premenstrual Mood Disorders, Perimenopausal Mood Disorders, Perinatal Depression and Bipolar Disorder, and the latest in Prenatal Diagnostic Testing.

Target Audience

Psychiatrists, obstetrician/gynecologists, pediatricians, general practitioners, and allied health professionals who care for women.

Educational Objectives

- Reduce morbidity and mortality associated with undiagnosed psychiatric disorders that present in relation to the female reproductive lifecycle, such as premenstrual syndromes and perimenopausal depression.
- Reduce morbidity and mortality associated with pregnancy-related mood disorders by improving diagnostic abilities.
- Identify patients with risks for mood disorders following pregnancy loss or termination and develop treatment options to decrease post-pregnancy loss mood disorders.
- Develop treatment options for women with perinatal psychiatric symptoms to decrease mood and anxiety disorders in pregnant and breastfeeding women.
- Reduce the risks of birth defects in women with perinatal psychiatric disorders by referring for appropriate genetic counseling and prenatal testing.
