

Target Audience

Cardiologists, cardiac surgeons and physicians with an interest in Comparative Healthcare Systems and Cardiovascular Treatments.

Course Description/Statement of Need

In this moment there is a great interest in the medical and health management community to analyze the factors that can improve medical outcomes and contain costs. According to a recent World Health Organization (WHO) statistic released in 2007, Cardiovascular Diseases in the USA and Italy are the leading cause of death, and these pathologies account for the greatest expenditures in both healthcare systems.

Our course is designed to focus on the comparative healthcare system in the USA and Italy as well as the cardiovascular treatments each country considers the present standard and possible future directions for both. Over the course of three days at the new San Donato Hospital in Milan, you will hear from experts in healthcare systems and policy as well as cardiologists and cardiac surgeons with American and Italian representatives.

Educational Objectives

Describe and contrast the current healthcare systems of the US and Italy as they pertain to preventative care and access to care, and discuss the WHO core health indicators and mortality data, comparing the U.S. to Italy.

Discuss the factors that contribute to the cost of care in the US versus Italy. Compare and contrast cost components of each system: physician, hospital, insurance, pharmaceutical industry.

Recognize the role of medical management, percutaneous coronary intervention and surgery in the management of coronary artery disease.

Discuss noninvasive testing for valvular heart disease, medical management, non-surgical interventions and optimum timing of surgery.

Describe models of healthcare delivery systems of the future that emphasize outcomes and costs.




