TARGET AUDIENCE

The above Annual Course responds to the needs of three groups of physicians.

(1) Resident physicians taking Part I of the written Board Certification Examination (2) Young physicians in their first year of practice who need to take Part II of the (Oral) Board Examination: to improve their clinical management skills and thereby improve their performance on this oral examination;

(3) Physicians in the practice of PM&R who need Continuing Education credits to update their knowledge base in the Specialty and to meet State, Medical Center and Licensure requirements for credits In Continuing Education.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This intensive six-day and three-evening review course will examine current practice with emphasis on recent advances in the field of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. Ample time will be provided throughout the course for questions. One to one registrant-faculty practice oral examinations will be available for registrants on Tuesday or Thursday evening.

STATEMENT OF NEED

The goal of this course is to deliver a comprehensive review and update of the field of physical medicine and rehabilitation for candidates taking Part 1 and 2 of the required Board exams and to serve as an update for practitioners.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- After completing the board review course, you will successfully pass the board review exam.
- Given the review of the topics presented during the review course, you will demonstrate comprehension of topics presented on the board review exam-
- Following this course, participants will gain the skills and knowledge necessary to complete the board review exam. Summarize new concepts presented.
- As a result of studying the materials provided for the exam, you will apply new diagnostic techniques to your clinical practice and perform new procedures when appropriate for your patient.
