There are many recent technological advances in imaging techniques which can be applied in current clinical practice. Maintenance of certification requires continued review of essential imaging techniques in all areas of radiology, including body imaging and musculoskeletal imaging.

This course is designed for practicing clinical radiologists, particularly those who concentrate on body and musculosketal imaging.

Course Description

This 4-1/2 day course is focused toward imaging of the chest (including cardiac), abdomen and musculosketal systems. This allows a more in-depth review of current imaging techniques within these fields. The lectures will allow the audience to improve their diagnostic skills while obtaining a thorough understanding how to creatively exploit the benefits of the newest technology as applied to these body regions. The course will also include daily "unknown case" sessions where the registrants can challenge themselves on some clinical "double black diamonds." There is ample time for one-on-one discussions with the faculty facilitating interchange of ideas.

Educational Objectives

After attending this course, the participant should be able to:

- Apply new body and musculosketal MR and CT techniques, including multi-detector CT scanning and MR imaging.
- Review recent advances in diagnosis of the chest, heart, abdomen and musculosketal systems.
- Evaluate the techniques necessary to obtain functional images in the heart and kidneys.
- Utilize state-of-the-art imaging equipment in an optimal fashion as applied to these disorders.
- Improve diagnostic accuracy using 3-D imaging techniques.

Snowmass and Aspen, Colorado

The Silvertree Hotel
