Course Description

This 4 1/2-day course has been designed to cover a wide variety of cutting-edge imaging techniques including Advanced Neuro Imaging (MRA, CTA, Spectroscopy, Perfusion and Diffusion); Cardiac Imaging (CT, MR and PET); Breast Imaging (Breast MR and Medical-Legal Aspects); PET applications (Fundamentals, Oncology, Neuro); along with recent advances in Pediatric Radiology. A review of basic subject material will be offered but the thrust of this course is to present 'cutting-edge' material.

Presentations will emphasize image interpretation, differential diagnosis, and will include a review of disease processes. In addition to formal presentations, the program will feature daily challenging cases with prizes awarded.

It is the intent of the organizers to provide very practical clinical material with ample opportunity for discussion and interchange of ideas. The Department of Radiology at the NYU School of Medicine prides itself on having state-of-the-art imaging equipment and disseminating information to the practicing clinical radiologist interested in sharpening his/her diagnostic skills.

After attending this course, the participant should be able to:

- Apply new cutting-edge MR, CT and PET imaging techniques.
- Review recent advances in diagnosis of the heart, abdomen and brain, head & neck and spine.
- Utilize state-of-the-art imaging equipment in an optimal fashion as applied to these disorders.
- Review recent advances in Pediatric radiology.
