## Monday, August 1, 2011

#### **Historic Walking Tour**

9:00am - 11:00am

\$24 per person

Take a leisurely 1½ - 2 hour stroll through more than 400 years of history, art, and culture. This walking tour presents an extraordinary introduction Santa Fe, and provides an entertaining, humorous and accurate portrayal of the "City Different." A professional local guide will lead the group to the historic Plaza and to the Palace of the Governors. Learn about the St. Francis Cathedral, explore the Loretto Chapel and its miraculous staircase, and other major Santa Fe historical sites before returning to the hotel. Includes: Local guide and tax. **Minimum 10 persons** 

#### Bandelier National Monument 1:30pm – 6:00pm

\$120 per person

Enjoy a boxed lunch during an approximately 30 minute drive outside Santa Fe to the "must see" Bandelier National Monument. Located on the Pajarito Plateau of the Jemez Mountains, Bandelier was the home of the Anasazi Indians, colloquially "the Ancient Ones", from the 11<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup> centuries. Excavated over 90 years ago, these ruins were once home to over 200 people, ancestors of today's Pueblo Indians. Walk along easy paths past the remains of ancient dwellings, to the cliff dwellings where you can climb ladders to peer inside. If time permits, take a walk further up the path that leads to the Ceremonial Cave, where the Anasazi and later descendants held spiritual rites and celebrations. (This trail is classified moderate to difficult due to the 140' of vertical climb up ladders.) From Bandelier, proceed to the San Ildefonso Pueblo along the banks of the Rio Grande. One of the six Tewa speaking villages in Northern New Mexico, San Ildefonso is famous for its "black on black" pottery. Maria Martinez, perhaps the most famous of all Pueblo potters, was from this village and many of her descendants still reside and make pottery here. Short stops will be made at a local pottery shop and the pottery museum. Includes: Round trip transportation, boxed lunch, professional guides, entrance fees, taxes and gratuities. **Minimum 10 persons**

In Puccini's hands, the affaire d'amour between Mimi and Rodolfo became one of the most poignant and most popular operas ever written. Paul Curran's celebrated 2007 production returns with Ana María Martínez and David Lomeli as the star-crossed lovers. #### Fly Fishing in New Mexico

For the novice to the expert, New Mexico offers some of the finest fly fishing west of the Mississippi. Imagine fishing mountain streams so infrequently fished that it is not uncommon to hook up to 100 fish per day! If you're an angler rather than a fly fisherman, don't worry. This trip can also accommodate you. Advise us in advance so that the correct equipment will be on hand. Includes: Round trip transfers, professional guide, state license, all equipment (rod, reel, waders, and tackle box), box lunch, refreshments, tax and gratuities. **Minimum 3 persons** 

#### Museums/Gallery Tour

Enjoy a private guided 4-hour tour of four of the finest museums in the United States. The tour begins with what is perhaps Santa Fe's most unique museum, the Museum of International Folk Art. Celebrating folk art from around the world, including work from over 100 countries, elaborate dioramas from 19<sup>th</sup> century Germany, New Mexican quilts, Mexican masks, South American and African puppets, amulets, talismans, and an endless array of figurines and ceremonial clothing. The Museum of Indian Arts and Culture will introduce the group to the historical and contemporary lives of the Pueblo, Navajo and Apache cultures. The museum features rotating displays from its collection of Southwestern Indian artifacts, as well as many other interpretive artifacts, arts, crafts and photographs. Next, visit the Spanish Colonial Arts Museum. This beautiful museum was designed by famed New Mexico architect, John Gaw Meem. The Hispanic community has contributed a beautiful collection of retablos, tinwork and rugs. Last on the stop will be the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum. This museum features the works of one of the most proclaimed female artist in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Georgia O'Keeffe was influential in forming the artist community in Santa Fe and the southwest. Includes: Round trip transportation, private guide, entrance fees, and tax. **Minimum 10 persons** 

#### **River Rafting**

#### 10:00am - 2:30pm

The five-mile Racecourse section of the Rio Grande is the most popular river rafting trip. A wild class III+ ride during the spring high-water, July and August trips become a more technically demanding runs as the water goes down and the rocks come up. During summer runs, the guide will depend on riders to help maneuver the raft through many tight spots. In addition, as the water warms up there are more opportunities for warm-water fun, such as swimming and boat surfing! Enjoy a fresh trout lunch riverside! The Racecourse is a great trip for whitewater enthusiasts, as well as experienced rafters looking for a quick adrenaline fix. Minimum age is six, although this may be adjusted in high water run off conditions. Maximum weight limit is 230 lbs. Includes: Round trip transfers, professional guide, equipment, lunch, tax and gratuities. **Minimum 6 persons.**
