

Target Audience

This course is intended for practicing clinical radiologists interested in learning the latest advances in imaging techniques.

Course Description

This course will cover a broad spectrum of topics focusing on the brain, body (chest & abdomen), musculoskeletal imaging, breast imaging, and pediatric radiology.

A review of basic subject material as well as recent advances in imaging techniques will be featured during this 4 1/2-day course. It is the intent of the organizers to provide very practical clinical material to the audience with ample opportunity for discussion and interchange of ideas.

To increase the participants' knowledge of imaging applications, techniques and interpretive skills in a wide variety of image modalities.

Expected Outcomes

Participants should increase their knowledge and abilities to perform CT, MRI, and mammography, and to sharpen their diagnostic skills in interpreting the studies.

Meeting Registration and Lift-Ticket Distribution:

Snowmass and Aspen, Colorado

Snowmass Village offers some of the world's best ski-in and ski-out accommodations and has many opportunities for dining and shopping. In addition, Snowmass is a short drive from Aspen, Colorado with premier dining and shopping as well.

Four major ski areas are possible with one lift ticket (Buttermilk for beginners; Snowmass for all levels; Aspen Highlands and Aspen Mountain are suitable for intermediate to expert ski levels). A free bus connects the four mountains.

Travel to Snowmass, Colorado


Premier Travel will be handling travel, car rental and discounted lift ticket arrangements for this meeting. Snowmass is located 200 miles west of Denver. There are frequent flights into the Aspen Airport from Denver. Another good alternative for a wider flight selection is the Eagle County Airport, outside Vail (2-hour drive with ground transportation possible from Aspen).

Please note the meeting concludes on Friday morning, so you may return early or stay for the weekend.

Discounted Ski Lift Tickets

Lift tickets must be purchased **in advance** through Premier Travel at a savings of approximately 25% from on site. Refer to the attached Ski Lift Ticket Form and note that payment must be received by February 15, 2004. Totally unused lift tickets are refundable minus \$25 service fee until March 26, 2004, but once any portion is used, the remaining days cannot be refunded. The starting date for use of the tickets is Sunday, March 14, 2004.





The Silvertree Hotel

A block of rooms has been reserved at the Silvertree Hotel with its fabulous ski-in and ski-out location. Rooms feature coffee makers, refrigerators, hairdryers and many have balconies. The hotel has an in-house ski shop and arrangements will be made for discounts on ski equipment rentals. The Silvertree also features a health club with steam room and massage therapy, two outdoor heated pools (slopeside), whirlpools and saunas.

For those arriving at the Aspen Airport, the Silvertree provides complimentary airport transportation.

The room block begins on March 13th with a few rooms possible on Friday night, March 12th and concludes on Friday, March 19th with some limited rooms possible on Saturday, March 20th.

If you are looking for less expensive lodging convenient to the Silvertree, a small block of rooms is being held at the Wildwood lodge directly across the street with rates of \$215 per night plus taxes (including breakfast for two).

Condo Block

A small block of condos are reserved at the Lichenhearth (1-bedroom), the Woodbridge (2-bedroom), Terracehouse (2-bedroom) and Interlude (2-bedroom) condos. Follow the same procedure by calling the Silvertree (see below). Reservations can advise you of condo locations and tell you about the free bus service in Snowmass.

It is important that you book your room as far in advance as possible and indicate that you are part of the "NYU Radiology" group to receive the special rates. Extra person charge is \$25 per person per night. Children under 12 stay free in parents' room. Rollaways are \$25 per night and cribs are free.
