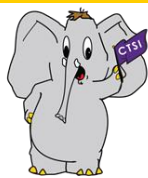
CEPHR Seminar with Dr. Sonia Angell, MD, MPH: January 29, 2015

CTSI Hosts Team Science Workshops Funded by the National Science Foundation

On November 6 & 7, 2014, the CTSI hosted three team science workshops funded by the National Science Foundation, which were facilitated by Drs. Theresa Lant (Pace University) and Maritza Salazar (Claremont Graduate University). The first workshop focused on strategic mapping for research team leaders. The goal was to help each team leader fine-tune objectives of their team in regards to grant writing, identify resources needed to accomplish the team's aims, and to master best practices for cross-boundary communication. The second workshop targeted the entire research team and focused on communication principles. More specifically, the research teams would hone in on and learn to master communication skills that support sharing, integration and creation. Individuals who participated in the workshops were from the following departments: OSR, Population Health, Emergency Medicine, Rehabilitation Medicine, Medicine/CTSI, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the School of Engineering.
